Greetings,



The Timberline Activities Committee invites you to take part in Timberline District's 2017 Fall Camporee. This event will be held in the Lower Meadow at Camp Tahosa on September 22 - 24, 2017.

This year's theme is "An Amazing Race". The Activities Committee has assembled some great activities for this event

The 2017 Camporee will provide opportunities for Scouts to test their preparation and skills in a patrol atmosphere. On Saturday, patrols will participate in interesting and fun events requiring Scout skills, creativity and Scouts working together as a patrol. There will also be "An Amazing Race" requiring Scouts to demonstrate their navigation skills and expertise in other areas. Ribbons and prizes will be awarded based on Patrol performances throughout the day. Patrols should also prepare a skit and/or a song for the campfire, and bring their Patrol flag. Judging of skits, and songs will be during the day at one of the stations, and the best of the best will be presented at the Campfire.

The Camporee also offers a unique opportunity for Webelos and Arrow of Lights. Troops are encouraged to invite them to the Camporee to camp with them, participate in the events and observe Scout Troops in action.

Scouts, Webelos and Arrow of Lights who are unable to camp overnight are encouraged to participate in Saturday's program.

Remember, Camp Tahosa is at 9,000 ft and it is Colorado in September; bring spare clothing for cold, rain, snow and any other kind of weather.

It is the intention of the Activities Committee to offer a unique quality Scouting program for all Scouts and Scouters. To help achieve this goal, we are asking each troop to provide one older (over 13) Scout or Scouter per patrol to help run the programs we will be offering.

Come and enjoy a visit to Camp Tahosa. A special patch will be presented to every participant.

2017 CAMPOREE GUIDELINES AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- A. Guidelines: The rules and guiding principles for the 2017 Camporee shall be the Scout Oath and Scout Law. Safety guidelines shall meet or exceed those outlined in the BSA Guide to Safe Scouting.
- B. **Registration:** Troops must register online at www.timberlinedistrict.com. Online registration ends September 20 at 11:59 PM.

BOY SCOUT - CAMPING :

Early registration runs **June 27, 2017 through September 8, 2017**. The early registration fee for all Boy Scouts and Adults camping is **\$30.00**. After **September 8** the regular registration fee will be **\$45.00**. Participants arriving for the weekend on Friday night without pre-registering will pay **\$60.00**.

BOY SCOUT - ONE DAY PARTICIPATION:

Early registration runs **June 27, 2017 through September 8, 2017**. The early registration fee for Boy Scouts and Adults attending Saturday only is **\$20.00**. After **September 8**, the regular registration fee is **\$35.00** per Scout or Adult.

WEBELOS and ARROW OF LIGHTS - CAMPING :

Early registration runs **July 27, 2017 through September 8, 2017**. The early registration fee for all Webelos/Arrow of Lights and Parents camping is **\$20.00** each. After **September 8**, the regular registration fee is **\$35.00**. Webelos/Arrow of Lights arriving for the weekend on Friday night without pre-registering will pay **\$50.00**.

WEBELOS and ARROW OF LIGHTS - ONE DAY PARTICIPATION:

Early registration runs **July 27, 2017 through September 8, 2017**. The early registration fee for Webelos/ Arrow of Lights and Parents attending Saturday only is **\$15.00** each. After **September 8**, the regular registration fee is **\$30.00** per Webelos and Parent.

- C. Participation by Webelos /Arrow of Lights and Their Supporting Adults: All Webelos/Arrow of Lights are invited to camp overnight, but must be guests of a Scout Troop. Webelos/Arrow of Light leaders needing help finding a Troop should call the Scout Service Center at 303-455-5522. The 2017 Camporee is an excellent opportunity for Webelos/Arrow of Lights to observe Scout Troops in action, have fun, and learn more about Scouting. Please list your hosting unit on Medical Forms. Each Webelos/Arrow of Light must have a parent attend as a chaperone.
- D. Driving directions: The Camporee will take place in the Lower Meadow at Tahosa High Adventure Base, 173 County Rd 96, Ward, CO 80481. Estimated driving time is approximately 1 1/2 hours. See page 10 for driving directions.
- E. Check-in Procedures: Check-In on Friday will be from 3:00 PM to 9:00 PM, and Saturday from 7:30 AM to 9:00 AM (for day visitors). For Saturday arrivals, please check the Camporee Program Schedule and, if possible, arrive before the program day starts.

At check-in, each unit should be prepared to present the following:

- 1. **A Final Unit Roster**. (Page 11-12) This finalized roster will be used to assign Patrols to the event schedule. Everyone listed on the roster will receive program souvenirs. Volunteers that will be helping on Saturday need to be circled (one per Patrol).
- 2. BSA Health and Medical Form, Parts A and B: for each person listed on the roster. This form is available at www.scouting.org/filestore/HealthSafety/pdf/680-001_AB.pdf. Every participant (youth or adult) must have a medical form on file in order to participate in the event. Please turn in a copy (instead of the original) of the medical form as these forms will not be returned.

- 3. Registration Information. The registrar will have information on registrations and fees paid online, but please bring a copy of your registration receipt in case there are any questions. All fees must be paid in advance to receive the early discount benefit. If you do not register online, please bring a copy of your receipt with you. Onsite payments may be made by check or exact cash.
- 4. **Drink Mix**. Each unit attending the Camporee is asked to provide one container of drink mix per Patrol at time of check in.
- F. Check-Out Procedures: Each unit must have its camp site inspected by staff prior to departure. Upon successful inspection, the unit leader should go to the HQ Check-Out Area to pick up their program souvenir envelope containing patrol ribbons, patches, etc. Please pick up this envelope before leaving. Follow the Outdoor Code in preparing your site for check-out. All units need to be checked out by noon on Sunday. Saturday Check-Out: Troops needing to check out Saturday should specify their check-out time on their Troop Roster. When ready to check-out, request a staff member at HQ to inspect your campsite. Units should have their campsites inspected before it gets dark. Upon satisfactory inspection, the unit leader should go to the HQ Check-Out Area to pick up their program souvenir envelope
- **G.** Parking Vehicles and Unloading Equipment: Parking permits will be required for all cars entering the site. Please display your Camporee Parking Permit on the dashboard. Please follow all signs, directions and prompts made by staff while driving and parking your vehicle, and please be patient and courteous. Vehicles will be allowed to transport gear to campsites, but must move to the parking area as soon as they are unloaded. The number of vehicles allowed into the camping area at any given time may be limited to prevent congestion. While each Troop may have one trailer in their campsite, absolutely no vehicles will be allowed to remain at the campsite. If persons in your unit have special needs requiring a vehicle at your site, please send a request to Larry Svoboda, Isvobod@gmail.com, so that proper arrangements can be made in advance.
- **H. First Aid**: Emergency medical services will be provided by Venture Crew 911 during the Camporee. They are available for all major first aid needs. Each Unit should have a good first aid kit in their campsite and handle all minor first aid occurrences.
- I. Campsites: Campsites will be assigned based on when units register and troop size indicated at registration. A campsite map will be given to you at time of Check-In. Please remember that no tents, tarps, etc. may be tied to trees or structures.
- J. Cooking & Fires: At the time of printing, charcoal fires will be allowed, as long as they are off the ground and in a container. No unattended fires will be allowed. There must be no visible evidence of fire when you leave. Units are encouraged to use propane for cooking. <u>PLEASE NOTE: Fire Restrictions are subject to</u> <u>modification at any time up to check in at the Camporee.</u> The Camp Ranger will be the final authority on whether or not fires will be allowed. Any changes in the Fire Restrictions will be announced as soon as information is available..
- K. Water: Each unit is responsible for bringing their own water. A limited amount of water is available at the site.
- L. Trash: This is a low impact event. Everything brought in must be packed out, including trash, garbage, ashes, etc. Do not leave trash at the site.
- **M.** Toilets: In addition to the permanent toilets in the lower meadow, portable toilets will be provided as appropriate. Please remind your scouts to be courteous, keep the toilets clean, and observe posted restrictions such as "Women Only" and "Staff Only." Troops are responsible for providing hand washing facilities at their site. Please advise staff when additional toilet paper or other service is required.
- N. Drink Stations: Drink stations will be available during Saturday's program. Each participant should add a cup to their 10 essentials. Every patrol needs to bring a container of drink mix for use at these stations. Please list this on your Unit/Troop Roster in the space provided. These will be collected during Check-In.

- **O. Quiet Time**: All lights are to be extinguished by 10:30 PM. As a courtesy to others, please observe QUIET TIME from 10 PM to 6 AM.
- P. Special Needs: If there are participants in your Unit that require special accommodations, please notify Larry Svoboda, Isvobod@gmail.com, so that the necessary arrangements can be made.

Q. Miscellaneous:

No pets are allowed during this event. No personal weapons, ammunition, or fireworks of any sort are allowed. No alcoholic beverages, marijuana or illegal drugs are permitted. No smoking in event or campsite areas. Adults are asked not to smoke in the presence of Scouts.

- **Recipe:** Are the ingredients and directions clearly stated? Could the entry be duplicated using the instructions?
- **Overall:** What is your overall impression?

Judging will be performed by a panel of independent youth with experience in eating. DECISION OF THE JUDGES IS FINAL! Results will be announced at the Sunday morning Universal Church Service.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP TAHOSA

Camp Tahosa is located at 173 County Rd 96, Ward, CO 80481. Follow C-470 north over I-70 to US 6 West. Continue straight onto Hwy 93 to Boulder. In Boulder, turn left on Canyon (Hwy 119) Continue on Hwy 119 to Nederland and exit the round-a-bout on Hwy 72 north. You will pass the town of Ward. Continue about 4 1/2 miles past Ward and look for the Boy Scout Camp sign. Turn left onto County Rd. 96. Proceed past the main entrance on the left and look for signs directing you to Camporee unloading and parking.

NOTE: There is no cell phone service in this area. You cannot rely on your cell phone for directions!
