Fishing - Class is limited to 10 scouts • There is a \$5 cost on top of the registration cost • Part of this class will be in the classroom setting and part of it will be off site • Transportation from the church to the fishing site and back will be provided • Please wear appropriate gear including closed toed shoes • Pants are highly recommended • Make sure to have your 10 essentials including water • bring a camp chair if desired • Class is about 8 hours long • If you have your own fishing gear please bring it

Wilderness Survival: Class is limited to 8 scouts • <u>this class starts on *Friday* at 5pm please be</u> <u>aware if you show up on Saturday you will get a partial for the class</u> • This class requires sleeping outdoors • the 10 Essentials, including water, are needed • Because the weather can change quickly, please be prepared for any changes from hot to cold • This class is in November and goes overnight so please plan accordingly so you will be warm • This class is 8 hours long on Saturday • Please have fed the scout on Friday night or send a simple meal for them to eat • Please send a simple breakfast for Saturday morning • Only lunch on Saturday will be provided
